<u>iPhone</u>

- 1. Tap Settings > General > Reset
- 2. Tap 'Erase all content and settings'







- 3. Enter passcode/Face ID/fingerprint
- 4. Tap 'Erase iPhone/iPad'
- 5. Enter Apple ID password
- 6. Your iPhone/iPad will now factory reset

Android

<u>Huawei</u>

- 1. Tap Settings.
- 2. Tap System.
- 3. Choose Reset.
- 4. Tap Reset all settings.
- 5. Tap Reset all settings.
- 6. Confirm the action by tapping on Reset all settings.
- 7. Wait for factory reset to finish.





Android

Samsung Phone

- 1. Go to Settings, then General Management.
- 2. From there, tap on Reset, which you can find at the bottom.
- 3. You will see three options Reset settings, Reset network settings and Factory data reset.
- 4. Tap Factory Reset. You should then see a long list of accounts, apps, etc. which will be erased from your phone.
- 5. If you've made up your mind, scroll to the bottom and tap Reset.



Other Android Phones

- 1. Go to Settings and scroll all the way down to find System.
- 2. Tap on System and find the Reset option.
- 3. From the list, tap on Eralse all data (factory reset).
- 4. You will see a list of data that will be erased, along with signed in accounts and the Reset phone option on the bottom.
- 5. Tap it and select Delete all data.
